• Now you have learned the 32 letters of the Coptic Alphabet. Note that the Alphabet has 24 consonants and 7 vowels (λ-ε-μ-ι-ο-γ-ω) and 1 letter used as a number ₹.

### Jinkem ()

It looks like an accent `When placed over a consonant letter, it adds the sound e to the letter, like  $\hat{\mathbf{n}}$  sounds "en". If it is placed over a vowel, it increases its duration and makes it as a separate vowel.
